




## Welcome to Domaine Permacole de Pourpry!

Due to our small size and the fact that we carry out our activity in a private form, we are not considered as an ERP (Establishment open to the Public) nor do we have an IOP (Installations Open to the Public) and therefore are not subject to the associated standards.

However, below is a description of our accessibility efforts in our resort :

Concerning mobility, the castle is located in an 8 hectare park, entirety on a 15% slope. The only flat space is therefore the one located between the castle, the outbuilding and the car park, i.e. an area of  $15m \times 20m = approximately 300 \text{ m}^2$ , on which PRMs and wheelchairs can circulate without difficulty, with the exception of one small strip of deep gravel.

Everything else must be considered inaccessible to PRMs due to slope.



The entrance nevertheless presents a difficulty for wheelchairs due to the gravel which can be deep on approximately 2m. It is planned to create a rolling concrete strip but it has not yet been built.

However, on several occasions we have already authorized cars to temporarily park on the hard plaza in front of the main door to allow wheelchairs to be left.

Once on the esplanade, a gentle slope up to the entrance door was created and the 3 steps leading to the castle were eliminated.

There remains the step of the porch of only 10 cm, very easy to cross.

Once entered into the castle, all circulation is on one level (access to the living room, the dining room, the library and the terrace), with the exception of a small 10cm sloping step to access the rooms.

The terrace which is accessible is the high terrace, with a surface area of 25m<sup>2</sup>. The 2nd terrace of 300m<sup>2</sup> is only accessible with a staircase of 12 steps from the 1st, but there is no railing at present (in planning).

Regarding the bedroom area, there is first of all a separate toilet, equipped for disabled people (raised bowl, support bars, lowered hand basin).

All rooms have a WC but none are equipped for disabled people.

Among the 4 accessible rooms, only the "luxury room" is equipped with a walk-in shower but it does not have support bars. The others are classic showers with a tray raised 14 to 22cm depending on the room.

The counter where payment is made has a lowered part.

There is currently no specific system facilitating access for hard of hearing, deaf, mute or blind people.
